## SUPPLEMENTARY SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

### 1 SCHEDULE OF RACES

**1.1 Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> August**  
15:00 Registration, measurement and equipment inspection, Saltsjöbaden  
19:00 Welcome and briefing  
Base camp: Saltsjöbaden

**Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> August**  
10:00 Warning signal for the first leg of the day  
Two legs scheduled  
Base camp: Lökholmen (next to Sandhamn)

**Friday 25<sup>th</sup> August**  
Two or three legs scheduled  
Base camp: Fejan

**Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> August**  
Two or three legs scheduled  
Base camp: Sandhamn/Lökholmen

**Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> August**  
Two legs scheduled  
~ 16:00 Finish in Saltsjöbaden  
TBD Prizegiving ceremony

The starting time for Friday, Saturday and Sunday will be announced no later than 21.00 the day before the race day.

1.2 The race committee reserves the right to modify the programme above according to weather conditions and/or other unforeseen reasons.

1.3 When all boats have finished a leg, the Race Committee vessel will remove the orange flag. To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is made

## **2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS**

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board (ONB) on the internet at [www.stockholmarchipelagoraid.com](http://www.stockholmarchipelagoraid.com)
- 2.2 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flag pole on board the Race Committee starting vessel moored in the harbour of the base camp.
- 2.3 The Race Committee will try to inform all competitors on VHF channel 71 regarding starting times, boats failing to start correctly, any course changes etc. Failure to make a broadcast or to time it accurately will not be grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

## **3 COURSES AND MARKS (CP)**

- 3.1 The courses with check points for each day will be described in a team briefing in the morning each day.
- 3.2 The positions (WGS 84) and descriptions of all check points are available on the official notice board.

## **4 TIME LIMITS**

- 4.1 There are no time limits, but the Race Committee may decide to shorten a leg at any time for any reason by deleting one or more check points. Boats will be informed orally, via VHF or on an information board (white board) as they round a Check Point. The finish line may be moved to a check point.

## **5 CHANGES TO THE RACING RULES AND APPENDIX S**

- 5.1 No national prescriptions will apply.
- 5.2 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted 1 hour before the warning signal on the day it will take effect. This changes RRS Appendix S 3.1.

5.2 RRS 26 is changed. Races will be started as follows:

5	Flag with no. 5	One	Warning signal
4	Flag with no. 4*, flag no. 5 removed	One	Preparatory signal
1	Flag with no. 1, flag no. 4 removed*	One long	One minute
0	Flag no. 1 removed	One	Starting signal

\*Any starting penalty flag in accordance with RRS 30 will be displayed and removed with the preparatory signal flag.

5.3 RRS Appendix S 10.1 is deleted. See item 4.1.

5.5 Rules for support persons

- a) Support persons shall follow Swedish Sailing Federation safety code.
- b) Support person shall follow RRS 1, 2 and 55 and not subject a competitor to risk breaking RRS 41.
